- Atlas Copco (Sweden): \$21-28 million
- Ingersoll Rand (USA): \$19-25 million
- Sullair (Japan): \$18-23 million
- Rotair (Italy): \$15-20 million
- Local assembly options: \$12-18 million

Pro tip: Ask suppliers about Nigeria's 5% import duty waiver for construction equipment - this could save \$1-1.4 million on European models.

Need heavy-duty power? Atlas Copco's XATS 136 delivers 375 CFM for quarry operations, available through their Port Harcourt warehouse. Always request factory test certificates to avoid refurbished units.

Your 5-Step Buying Checklist

- Verify CFM (airflow) matches your tools' requirements
- Check warranty terms (2+ years preferred)
- Confirm parts availability in Lagos/Abuja
- Compare fuel efficiency (litres/hour)
- Ask about after-sales service contracts

Most suppliers like Equipment and TrukWorx offer free site inspections. "We brought a demo unit to their quarry for 3 days," says Sullair dealer Tunde Adebayo. "Proving reliability beats empty promises."

As Nigeria's Lassa Construction just ordered six Rotair units for their Calabar highway project, the clock ticks for competitors still using outdated compressors. With diesel prices hitting ₦1,200/litre in some states, that 15% fuel savings from premium brands might decide your next profit margin.
