Drill bits (EUR150-EUR300/day)

Operator fees (EUR400+ daily)

Transport (EUR0.80-EUR1.20 per km)

Prime Suppliers like LOCATOUT and Kiloutou now offer all-inclusive packages at EUR3,400-EUR4,100/month - 14% cheaper than 2023 rates. Ask about their "Project Horizon" deals for metro expansions in Bordeaux.

Why Rent When You Could Buy?
