The ROI-Boosting Buying Guide

Want the same drilling bit price in New Zealand deals as major companies? Follow this checklist:

- Confirm carbide tooth thickness (≥ 2.5 mm for hard rock)
- Check NZTA-compliant shipping insurance
- Verify supplier membership in Mining Equipment Recyclers Alliance

Hamilton-based supplier TerraSource reported a 40% jump in used bit demand since June 2023. "We're now selling reconditioned bits faster than new stock," says GM Liam Wallace. "Smart operators realize they get 80% performance at 45% price."

While global used tool markets grow at 7.2% annually, New Zealand's unique geology means local inspection matters most. One Wellington buyer recently found "like new" bits actually had incompatible API thread types - a \$7,500 mistake avoided by checking certifications first.

As diesel costs hit NZ\$2.80/liter, efficient bits matter more than ever. The right second hand drilling bit cuts fuel use by 18% compared to worn tools, according to 2024 MPI data. That's NZ\$210 saved daily on a typical 300hp rig.
