A German contractor lost EUR28,000 last year buying uncertified bits that failed mid-project. Don't let this happen:

Ignoring ISO 9001 certification - Always request documentation

Choosing price over lifespan - Calculate cost per meter drilled

Missing tax credits - Netherlands offers 18% VAT reduction for recycling equipment
