2025 Price Shocks (And How to Avoid Them)

The new 7% import duty on used mining tools has pushed some drilling bit prices in Nigeria up by ₦35,000-₦60,000 since January. However, certified dealers absorbed most tariffs through these strategies:

Pre-paid customs clearance for wholesale orders

Multi-year maintenance contracts (?15,000-?28,000/month)

Market Watch: Nigeria's 2024 drilling projects have increased by 23% (NNPC data). As demand grows, second-hand drilling bits now account for 61% of all purchases in Niger Delta operations. Major suppliers are expanding to Abuja and Kano with same-day delivery options.

For immediate quotations, check with Lagos-based vendors like DrillMaster Africa or China's Alibaba Gold Suppliers. Many now offer 48-hour price matching and cryptocurrency payments. Remember - certified used bits perform 80-90% as well as new models but cost less than half the price.
